

News from the Project Coordinating Team

We trust you are all winding down a bit as another busy academic year comes towards a close – at least it does for some students!! We all know that academic staff don't usually have the same luxury of time out to forget about work when exams are over, but hopefully you will find time to relax and enjoy a less frenetic pace over at least a part of the summer.

Not only has it been a busy year for all those running SLT programmes but the NetQues project has had the benefit of partners working together and we are now finalising the presentation and publication of the results of the various surveys and data gathered. This has been a major task as we have so much good data but need to make sure it is presented in an easily interpreted and meaningful fashion for a range of people from different backgrounds.

We have also been busy planning the closing Congress: **Communication Unites our Diversity**. We hope every partner will have a representative who has been working on the project, at the closing meeting in Ghent on $26^{th}/27^{th}$ September, and will also encourage University senior management and other interested persons to attend the final session on the morning of 27^{th} September. On the Friday the outcomes and future developments will be presented alongside an opportunity to see examples from partners of innovations and good practice in speech and language therapy education. To that end please do bring your examples. A Network is the forum for sharing ideas of what works – and even what doesn't – and we all in NetQues have a common goals – to provide the best and most relevant SLT education we can for our student professionals.

During the year we underwent a Monitoring Visit by EACEA in April. A small team consisting of the Project Coordinator, Finance Manager and a member of PMSG met in Brussels with the EACEA Project Officer and its Finance officer, who thoroughly examined all our progress to date, our management practices and financial accounting procedures. We are delighted to report that their feedback was very positive and they were very interested in what speech and language therapists do and how they are educated as well as monitoring if our project was realising its goals and aspirations. One administrative matter that is stressed is the need for all partners to make their claims accurately in a timely way so we need to ask you to make sure you get your claims into the system as soon as possible after working on the project. It is particularly important now that you get all claims for this final year's work in to us by 31 July or sooner and that you also submit the claim for the final meeting within a month of it taking place.

The EACEA teams were particularly keen to tell us that once a network such as this has been established and funded they will be keen to receive further applications which build on this work or spin off from it.



We were delighted to have a paper about the project accepted for presentation at the IALP congress in August in Turin. I do hope to see some of you there and hopefully also in the audience. If not then "See you in Ghent".
